Layer by Layer: Virginia McCoy and the Uncovering of Fort William First Nation

Layer by Layer: Virginia McCoy and the Uncovering of Fort William First Nation History is a new exhibit opening at The Thunder Bay Museum that explores Indigenous identity, family legacy, and colonial impact through visual storytelling. It features the work of artist Virginia McCoy (1948-2022), whose art was inspired by her deep familial ties to Fort William First Nation, alongside historical research tracing key events in the community's past.

The exhibit highlights critical moments of colonial disruption, including the 1849 establishment of the Fort William Mission, the Robinson-Superior Treaty of 1850, and the devastating 1905 land expropriation for railway development that geographically and spiritually divided the community. These historical milestones are examined through the lens of the McCoy family's experiences.



Virginia's ancestors, James McKay and Theodosie Pekkanakang, witnessed early missionary presence and treaty negotiations. At the same time, their sons, Moses and Alexander McCoy, played key leadership roles during a period of increasing colonial restrictions, including alcohol bans, the Indian Act, and increased governance over hunting rights.

A central theme of the exhibit is enfranchisement, a colonial policy that stripped Indigenous peoples of their legal status. Virginia's grandfather, Aloysius McCoy, was enfranchised in 1925 and forced to uproot his family from the reserve in hopes of a better life, and ultimately never regained his status. In the 1990s, following amendments to the Indian Act, Virginia was able to reclaim her own status, a deeply meaningful moment in her life and work.

Virginia's art represents a reclamation of identity, confronting themes of assimilation, loss and resilience. Her most notable exhibition, *Becoming White*, explored her family's journey through cultural erasure and re-identification, with select pieces featured in this show. This exhibit, *Layer by Layer*, presents a rich, layered narrative of cultural identity and survival of one family within the broader community of Fort William First Nation. The Thunder Bay Museum is excited to welcome visitors to view the exhibit later in October 2025, which will be available until early 2026.


Fort William First Nation's Restorative Justice Program: *The Magic of the Circle*

A new Restorative Justice Coordinator will soon be appointed through the Nokiwin Tribal Council, serving Fort William First Nation. This signals a return to traditional Restorative Circles for community members facing eligible criminal charges that may be diverted from the court system.

These circles are guided by tradition, beginning with a smudge and prayer, followed by the Seven Sacred Teachings. Participants speak using a talking stick or feather, ensuring respectful listening and no cross-talk. The process concludes with a healing plan and ceremonial elements like medicine ashes to be placed on the land and a hugging circle, reinforcing a good path forward.

Unlike the court system, Restorative Circles are confidential and non-judgmental, led by neutral facilitators and focused on accountability, healing, and community connection. Upon successful completion of a healing plan, the participant's charges may be withdrawn.

The Fort William First Nation Restorative Justice Program, in partnership with Nokiwin Tribal Council, will be hosting information sessions and accepting referrals for criminal diversion.
